




VET in Schools Guide











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Vocational Education; The pathway to a career

Considering what life after school might look like? Trying to decide what career pathway you might pursue?

Vocational Education courses (VET Courses) provide an opportunity to achieve a Nationally Recognised qualification or statement of attainment across a broad range of industries, whilst completing your Higher School Certificate. VET courses allow you to obtain real-life work skills and practical experience to assist you in transferring your learning in the classrooms into a meaningful career. Achieving a VET course can give you a significant advantage when entering the workforce, and open opportunities for further pathways for study.



Why VET in Schools?

VET in Schools offers direct pathways to further education and employment options. These pathways may include:

	Obtain a nationally recognised certificate or statement of attainment as a part of your HSC
; ó×	Courses may provide pathways to further qualifications or credit towards university course
	Complete a pre-traineeship program like the KTS Futures Program, that gives you skills to help enter the workforce

VET in Schools Delivery Options

What is EVET?

EVET is an externally delivered VET course, delivered by a Registered Training Organisation like KARBEN Training Solutions (KTS). An EVET course is delivered as a school subject and will include a mandatory work placement component where you can put your classroom learning into practice! With EVET, you can get a head start on your career by achieving a nationally recognised qualification- AND have it count towards your HSC!

KTS offers a broad range of EVET courses to students in Year 11 and Year 12 (Stage 6). Some of these courses are also eligible to count towards your Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR), if you elect to sit the HSC Exam for this subject.

What is a School-Based Traineeship?

A School Based Apprenticeship and Traineeship (SBAT) combines paid work, school and a VET qualification, assisting you to gain valuable work skills and experience while you are studying. Instead of completing work placement in blocks, an SBAT completes one day a week in paid employment with their employer in their chosen industry. An SBAT course can still count towards your HSC, may still be eligible to contribute to your ATAR (for certain courses) and enables you to achieve a nationally recognised qualification.

SBATs enter a training contract with their employer, school, RTO and Training Services NSW for the duration of their training contract and must agree to meet the contract requirements.

What is the Futures Program?

The Futures Program is an opportunity for you to explore what a career in the education and/or community services sector may look like, before committing to enrolling in an EVET or SBAT qualification.

- Carers of the Future caters for students considering a career in Community Services, Ageing or Disability Support Work.
- Educators of the Future caters for students considering work in Early Childhood Education and Care, or School Based Education Support (Teachers Aide).

EVET and SBAT Delivery Options:

	Face-to-face Participation at our KTS Training Facility in Wyong, generally on a weekly basis.
O O O O	Virtual delivery With mentor-led virtual classrooms and workshops, as well as work placement and workshops held at our KTS Training Facility in Wyong (which may include school holidays).



How to use this guide

EVET	This course is offered as an EVET course.
WP	This course includes mandatory work placement hours.
SBAT	This course is offered as a school-based traineeship. Qualifications that are available for school-based trainees may vary from the qualifications listed for EVET students.
BEC	This is a Board Endorsed Course that contributes to your HSC but will not count towards your ATAR.
FP	This course has a pre-traineeship program available for Year 9 and 10 students (Stage 5).
ICF	This is an Industry Curriculum Framework course that contributes to your HSC and can also contribute towards your ATAR.



A business qualification will provide you with high-level business skills that will help advance your career in both small and large businesses. It will expand your communication, leadership and management skills while strengthening your confidence, teamwork and collaboration skills, critical thinking and task management skills.

The units provided in this course are flexible and designed to apply to anyone working in a business environment.

This will give you the skills to develop as an education support teacher and help you learn to use a range of well-developed skills and knowledge to assist you to guide students throughout their learning journey's.


Is it right for you?

Frequently asked questions

Does my VET course contribute units towards my HSC?

Yes, all Stage 6 EVET courses count towards your HSC units. Stage 5 EVET courses contribute to your Record of School Achievement (RoSA).

Can my VET course be used in calculation of my ATAR?

Only some Stage 6 VET courses count towards an ATAR. Specifically, with KARBEN VET courses that count towards an ATAR includes *Business Services* and *Human Services* – *Pathway to Nursing*. These courses are specified by NESA and require students to complete a full 240 hours of delivery, as well as sit the HSC exam for the subject. You should check with your schools' careers adviser to ensure that you have a suitable pattern of study to be eligible for an ATAR.

How long with the course run for?

The course will run between one and two years, depending on the pattern of study undertaken.

What delivery options are available for VET courses?

KARBEN has a variety of delivery options to suit: face to face delivery at our KTS Training Facility in North Wyong, online, mentor-led virtual classrooms, workshops or a block delivery (which may involve attendance during the school holidays).

How are VET courses delivered?

VET courses have the same NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) requirements as other HSC courses. This means you will regularly attend classes and complete the set assessments. Most courses take between one and two years to complete and some classes may also extend outside of school hours and/or include work placement.

When do I attend class?

Depending on the delivery mode and the arrangement between your school and KARBEN, classes may require attendance at our KTS Training Facility on a weekly basis, or have an online, virtual connected classroom timetable. Class sessions may extend beyond school hours, including school holiday periods.



How do I apply?

Speak with your careers adviser to select a course that best meets your educational and vocational needs. Your school will then assist you with the application process.

What support services are offered?

We believe flexibility and support are essential in supporting the success of our students. Our approachable and knowledgeable KTS mentor team are available to students throughout the entire learning journey.

Can I get assistance if I have a disability?

Careful consideration will be given to the courses selected by students with a disability or additional needs to ensure it is an appropriate option for the students. To determine this we advise you discuss with careers advisor what additional support you may currently have or may need if you chose to do a VET course. The chosen course must be assessed as the most appropriate course for the student, and one that will provide successful vocational outcomes.

What is work placement?

Work placement is a mandatory requirement for many VET courses. It gives you the opportunity to apply the skills you've learnt in a real industry setting, as well as pick up any new skills 'on-the-job'.

Work placement will help you to:

- Gain insight into the kind of career you would like to have
- Make informed and educated decisions about further training and study
- Graduate job ready and more employable in the future.

Your careers adviser and KARBEN will help support the coordination of your work placement opportunities. You can suggest a preferred employer and as a team we can help support you in working to secure a placement with them.
